

Adult Resuscitation Trolley Arrest Drugs Checklist

Drugs Drawer:

Loose / Individual Cardiac Arrest Drugs as below.

Pre-filled syringe delivery is preference to mini-jets or ampoules where possible.

Anaphylaxis box (sealed by pharmacy)	One
Adrenaline pre-filled syringe 1 mg in 10 ml (1:10,000)	Six
Amiodarone pre-filled syringe 300 mg in 10 ml	Two
Atropine pre-filled syringe – at least 3 mg available (Potential options depending on pharmacy availability) (or 3mg in 10 ml – if 1 mg not available from Pharmacy)	One
Calcium Chloride pre-filled syringe 10% in 10 ml (preferred choice) alternatively Calcium Gluconate 10% 30mls	One
Sodium Bicarbonate 8.4% (dependant on pharmacy/supply availability);	
- polyfusor 200 ml x 1 (preferred choice)	One
<u>alternatively</u>	
- ampoules (IV injection) 10 mls (come in box of 10)	
Magnesium Sulphate 50% ampoule 5g in 10 ml (2 mmol/ml) (supplied as box of 10)	One
Naloxone	Five
- pre-filled syringe 400 mcg in 1 ml	minimum – (total
- ampoules 400 mcg	2000 mcg)
In IV fluid drawer:	
Glucose IV 10% 500 ml bag	One



The clinical areas below require X2 500ml bags of Intralipid 20% (reversal for local anaesthetic toxicity) in the IV fluid drawer;

- Theatres/PACU
- SDAU/Nettlewell Assessment Unit
- Labour Ward
- Alexandra Day Stay Unit (ADSU)
- Penn Ward
- Tye Green Ward
- ITU/HDU
- Harold Ward
- Henry Moore
- Kingsmoor Ward
- Bevan Ward

All of the following areas will have or receive patients with spinal/epidural procedures and therefore require Intralipid 20% to be available for emergency use.

Please also make sure you have checked your HYPOGLYCAEMIA EMERGENCY BOX. This is NOT to be kept on the Resuscitation Trolley.
